EXPERT ANALYSIS

1. Expert analysis of banknotes and coins


In January–September 2024, the expert analysis of suspect counterfeits detected 1,312 counterfeit dinar banknotes.

Table 1 shows the denomination structure of detected dinar counterfeits.

In the structure of detected counterfeits, the counterfeit 2000-, 1000- and 500-dinar banknotes accounted for the dominant share (71.32%, 11.89% and 11.43%, respectively) (Chart 1).



Percentage-wise, these three denominations together made up 95.20% of the total number of counterfeits detected in the observed period of 2024.

Looking at the past ten years, those three denominations have prevailed among detected dinar counterfeits (Chart 2).

In value terms, the 2000- and 5000-dinar banknotes made up the largest share of the dinar counterfeit structure (81.80% and 8.02%, respectively) (Table 2 and Chart 3).

In percentage terms, these two denominations made up 89.82% of all dinar counterfeits.




Chart 3 Denomination structure of dinar banknote counterfeits, January – September 2024 (nominally) A comparison of the number of detected banknote counterfeits with that of genuine dinar banknotes in circulation reveals that 2.17 in every 1 million circulating banknotes were found to be counterfeit, i.e. there was RSD 4,753.74 worth of counterfeits in every RSD 1 billion.


2. Expert analysis of foreign currency banknotes and coins

In the period January–September 2024, the expert analysis of suspect counterfeit banknotes detected 1,414 foreign currency counterfeits. Their currency and denomination structure are presented in Table 3.



In the observed period, 1,130 counterfeit euro banknotes were detected, mostly in 50- and 100-euro denominations. Chart 4 illustrates the trends observed over the last ten years in terms of the number of detected counterfeit 50-,100- and 200-euro banknotes.



In the observed period, 283 counterfeit US dollars were detected, 126 of them being 100dollar banknotes. Over the years, it has been noticed that 100-dolar banknotes accounted for the dominant share of counterfeit dollar banknotes.


Chart 5 shows movements in the number of detected 100-dollar counterfeits over the last ten years.





In the observed period, one counterfeit banknote of the 1000-Deutsche mark denomination was in the *Other* column in Table 3.


In nominal value terms, the share of individual currencies in total foreign cash counterfeits is best illustrated if expressed in euros,¹ as shown in Chart 6.



¹ For conversion of other currencies into euro, the exchange rates as at 4 October 2024 were applied (EUR 1 = RSD 117.0125).

3. Ratio of counterfeit dinar to foreign currency banknotes


Among the total of 2,726 counterfeit banknotes detected in the observed period, dinar counterfeits were the dominant category. Their share, as well as the share of foreign currency counterfeits in the total number of counterfeits, is given in Chart 7.



As shown, in terms of the number of pieces, the share of detected counterfeit dinar banknotes is the highest -1,312 pieces (48.13%), followed by the euro -1,130 pieces (41.45%), US dollar -283 pieces (10.38%), and one piece of Deutsche mark (0.04%).

In nominal value terms, the share of individual currencies in total counterfeit banknotes in the January–September 2024 period is best illustrated if expressed in dinars,² as shown in Chart 8.

² The middle exchange rate as at 4 October 2024 was applied to convert the value of other currencies to the dinar (117.0125).



Of the total amount of RSD 14,662,230.55 (dinar equivalent of the total nominal value of all other currencies' counterfeits), the share of counterfeit euro banknotes is the highest – RSD 10,794,988.19 (73.63%), followed by the dinar – RSD 2,305,500.00 (15.72%), the US dollar – RSD 1,501,914.86 (10.24%) and the Deutsche mark – RSD 59,827.50 (0.41%).

<u>Note</u>: In the observed period, the expert analysis was performed on 100 pieces of 1- and 2euro coins of which 35 pieces of 2-euro coins were found to be counterfeit.
